Design, write and debug programs which accomplish specific goals, including controlling or simulating physical systems; solve problems by decomposing them to smaller parts. To use sequence and repetition in programs; work with variables. To detect and correct errors in programmes

Pupils will read selected novels, as a starting point for developing skills through:

A variety of activities around the development of characters, plot and setting. Writing activities around plot including diary entries, recounts, retelling scenes and chapters. Independent story writing. Proof reading. Consider and evaluate different viewpoints. Speaking and Listening activities including performance of own composition, giving well structured explanations. **Grammar Focus:** modal and passive verbs, expanded noun phrases, commas for clauses.
