Lady Grace Mysteries: a fictional detective in a series of historical novels;

Astrosaurs: a series of science fiction novels by Steve Cole. The main characters are space-going dinosaurs;

Happy Families Series: with titles ranging from Miss. Jump the Jockey to Mr. Creep the Crook;

The Puffin Book of Stories for 7 Year Olds: Edited by Wendy Cooling;

Asterix: ideal for the reluctant boy reader;

Roald Dahl: everything, and anything by him;

Enid Blyton: Secret Seven, Favourite Five, Malory Towers etc.;

Dick King-Smith: stories often about animals;

Richmal Crompton: William Brown Books, of which, Just William is the first in the series;

Swiss Family Robinson: novel by Johann David Wyss to teach his sons family values, good husbandry, the use of the natural world and self-reliance;

Heidi: a series of novels about the events in the life of a young girl in her grandfather's care in the Swiss Alps. Written by Johanna Spyri;

Goodnight Mister Tom: a novel by Michelle Magorian following a young boy who is evacuated from London during the air-raids of WWII and put in the care of an elderly gentleman;

Jacqueline Wilson: commonly deals with such challenging themes as adoption, divorce, and mental illness;

Caroline Lawrence: author of The Roman Mysteries series of historical novels. The series is about a Roman girl called Flavia and her three friends: Nubia (a freed slave girl), Jonathan (a shunned Christian boy) and Lupus (a beggar boy without a tongue);

Anthony Horowitz: written many books (Power of Five, Alex Rider and Diamond Brothers series), appealing particularly to boys;

Geraldine McCaughrean: huge range of books, including the official sequel to Peter Pan;

Stephenie Meyer: Twilight series;

Cathy Hopkins: early teenage chick-lit;

Darren Shan: Demons, vampires etc.;

Philip Pullman: his dark materials;

Terry Pratchett: known for his frequently comical work in the fantasy genre.
